

SANTA ROSA VALLEY MUNICIPAL ADVISORY COUNCIL MINUTES
March 22, 2012

**The Santa Rosa Valley MAC held a Special Meeting on Thursday, March 22, 2012
at 6:00 p.m. at the Rancho Santa Rosa Property Owners' Association Club House,
11701 East Las Posas Road, Camarillo, CA 93012**

1. Call to Order

Rosemary Allison called the meeting to order at 6:15 p.m. MAC members Mark Burley and Don Shubert were present. MAC member Janis Gardner was absent.

2. Pledge of Allegiance

Gusie Woodfill led the Pledge of Allegiance.

3. Agenda Review

The agenda was adopted without revisions.

4. Approval of Minutes

Ruth Means moved to approve the February 16, 2012 minutes as submitted. **Mark Burley** made the second. Motion passed 3/0 with Don Shubert abstaining.

5. Comments of Ventura County Supervisor Linda Parks

Supervisor Linda Parks stated in response to **Kevin Cannon's** inquiry about the County budget, that the County's budget is growing but while some departments are not receiving their full requests, they are seeing modest increases. In addition, she said the County has a 10% reserve, but State and Federal may be making cuts that will affect health services.

6. Public Safety Reports

CHP Officer Mike Moriarty told the MAC that accident statistics for the Las Posas/Esollera intersection were reviewed and that there was no consistency in time of day or reasons for the crashes which all involved non-residents. In addition, in response to concern about speeding on Las Posas, Officer Moriarty said the radar trailer will be placed on Las Posas.

7. Public Comments

Kevin Cannon told the MAC that the Esollera design is in place, and, per Public Works' request that he meet with nearby residents, 2 of the 3 residents near the intersection were available to meet with him to discuss the changes.

Gusie Woodfill said the HOA wants the synchronized signal signs removed from the HOA property because they are subject to vandalism and have been hit by cars several times. Also, Gusie asked if the profanity painted on Vista Arroyo could be removed. Supervisor Parks' office will send the requests to Public Works.

8. Council Comments on Issues Not on the Agenda

Mark Burley said with respect to the very short portion of the trail easement which leads from Santa Rosa Park to Wildwood Preserve development's trail easement, that Santa Rosa Valley Trails Inc. is willing to pay for the survey and mapping if it can be added to the easement the City of Thousand Oaks agreed to grant to the County. **Supervisor Parks** agreed that continuation of the trail is important to link the County park with McCrea Ranch and beyond, and suggested that the MAC might like to prepare a presentation to the Board of Supervisors on the complete trail plan either at a Board meeting or at the Santa Rosa Park ribbon cutting. Mr. Burley said he would be happy to do so.

In addition, **Mark Burley** asked if Supervisor Parks' staff would obtain information on how much of the plastics placed in Santa Rosa Valley recycle bins is actually recycled, where it goes to be

recycled into what type of products, and whether there exists an opportunity to promote more recycling. The item was placed on the April 19th MAC agenda.

9. Action Items

a. Response from Tropical Paradise Camarillo

Rosemary Allison asked for copies of the letters for posting. No action was taken on this item.

b. CERT Trailer Training Class and Update on Location

Rosemary Allison said the training for the Santa Rosa Valley CERT team is scheduled for June 2nd at 10 a.m. No action was taken on this item.

10. Information Items

a. Tom Barber Driving Range

Janet Wall informed the MAC that the new hearing has not been scheduled.

b. Santa Rosa Equestrian Park Update

Supervisor Parks said that reservations for park use are currently being taken and that the ribbon-cutting ceremony will take place in mid May.

c. Las Posas Equestrian Bridge over the Arroyo Update

Mark Burley said the plans for the ADA compliant ramp were approved this week and Building and Safety will sign off on them tomorrow.

d. Moorpark Vineyard Church at Santa Rosa/Moorpark Intersection Update

Janet Wall said there is no new activity on the property.

e. Graffiti Removal Intervention Team Update (GRIT) Update

Mark Burley explained the arroyo has been completely painted on all sides to create a consistent finish and said the team is ready to paint any new graffiti that arises.

f. May 19, 2012 Community Beautification Event

Don Shubert said the CBE is on track for May 19th from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. at Santa Rosa Valley Technology Magnet School. **Rosemary Allison** said she would like to post the flyer on her website to publicize the event as soon as it is available. **Janet Wall** announced that a free landfill day will be available to Santa Rose Valley residents in Fall 2012.
